Gallery Artist Lynda Schlosberg awarded Fitchburg Art Museum solo exhibition

SOUTH END BOSTON, MA (June 28, 2017) – Visually electrifying the intersection of art and science, Lynda Schlosberg creates intricate paintings inspired by theories of quantum physics, which she explores through vibrant color, and an organized chaos of line, pattern, and visual movement. Two works by Schlosberg were selected for the 82nd Regional Exhibition of Art & Craft exhibition at the Fitchburg Art Museum (185 Elm Street Fitchburg, MA), on view now through September 3, 2017. On June 23rd Schlosberg's piece entitled, *A Messy Cloud of Probability* (acrylic on panel, 60 x 60 inches), received the Best In Show award which includes a solo exhibition at the Museum in Summer 2018. The 2018 exhibition of Schlosberg's work will be curated by Nick Capasso, Director of the Fitchburg Art Museum. For the Regional Exhibition, artists were able to submit one or two entries for consideration of original work produced within the last two years. Accompanying her winning piece in the exhibition is Schlosberg's painting, *The Heart of the Matter* (acrylic on panel, 48 x 60 inches).

The Fitchburg Art Museum, founded in 1925, serves the cities of Fitchburg, Leominster, and surrounding communities in North Central Massachusetts and Southern New Hampshire. The annual Regional Exhibition of Art & Craft is one of the oldest juried exhibitions in New England and celebrates the artistic excellence of the region. This year's Juror is Leonie Bradbury, curator of contemporary art, Director of Art and Creative Initiatives for HUBweek, and longtime Director and Curator of the Galleries at Montserrat College of Art in Beverly, MA. Of Schlosberg's work Bradbury says, "Schlosberg's paintings bring to mind galaxy formations in deep space and the view of matter at a nanoscopic level. Their infinite potentiality is part of the works' strength. They visualize the underlying interconnections of the universe and remind us that we are not separate beings, but rather are part of an intimately connected whole." The inclusion of Lynda Schlosberg's work in this prestigious exhibition speaks to her talent and the unique sense of

consciousness she creates through the colors and patterns she painstakingly layers on her canvasses.

Schlosberg has been an Artist Member of Kingston Gallery since 2012. She has worked as a graphic designer and fine art photographer for more than thirty years and began her painting career in 2008. Her artwork has been published in *Where Boston*, *Boston Home*, *Studio Visit* and *ArtBeat* magazines and reviewed in *The Boston Globe*, *Artscope* and the *Portland Press*. Schlosberg's paintings are included several corporate collections including BioMed Realty, New England Biolabs, and Biogen. Her work has been exhibited extensively throughout New England and she received the 2013 *Frances N. Roddy Award* from the Concord Art Association. Schlosberg received her MFA from the Art Institute of Boston at Lesley University, and her BFA from Ohio University College of Art. Lynda Schlosberg was born in Newton, Massachusetts and paints in her Waltham, Massachusetts studio.
